

At the end of an extraordinary two-year period for our graduating Year 12 students, the Principal and staff of Galen Catholic College congratulate all Year 12 students across the 2021 VCE and VCAL courses on their results. Our 2021 Year 12 students have done what no other Year 12 cohort has ever been asked to do: complete their final two years of schooling in the midst of a global pandemic with on-again, off-again online learning and disruptions to all eight school terms over the past two years.

We are very proud to announce that the Dux for Galen Catholic College in 2021 is Archie Gemmill with an ATAR of 97.65 placing him in the top 3% of students in the state. Archie was closely followed by Erin Chadban with 97.5 (also in the top 3% across the state).

We are particularly proud of the 4 Galen students who achieved ATARs of 90 or above placing them in the top 10% across the state. 16 Galen students achieved Study Scores over 40 in individual subjects placing them in the top 8% of all students across the state in those subjects.





Galen VET students also performed impressively as part of their VCE and VCAL certificates.

Whilst we are naturally proud of and happy for the large number of students who have achieved high scores, we are equally pleased to report that so many students have achieved to the best of their ability and have given themselves the best possible opportunity to move onto their preferred next steps in life whether that be employment, further study or a GAP year.

Galen Principal, Bernard Neal, said that the staff and Galen community are immensely proud of the efforts of the 2021 cohort. "This group faced challenges that no other Year 12 group has ever faced with not one school term in 2020 or 2021 running its full length with onsite classes. They adapted to these unique circumstances and made it through the year with courage and persistence.

"It is really important to note that we are equally proud of all students who put in their best effort regardless of their subject scores and ATARs and regardless of whether they completed their VCE or VCAL. We are proud to have played such a pivotal role in preparing these young people over their final six years of school education and especially so this year."

We are also pleased to announce that Galen Year 12 students have once again achieved 100% success rate in attaining their VCAL certificates.

Mr Neal also said, "The breadth and flexibility of opportunities available to our students through the 32 VCE subjects undertaken by Galen at school this year, along with VCAL, VET and School Based Apprenticeships, has enabled the senior students at Galen to tailor courses to suit their particular needs and interests, including the ability to combine elements of all four.

"Today's results will enable the Galen graduates now to step forward with confidence and a sense of achievement that opens new doors into their futures. We wish all the students well on the next stage of their journey - Galen will always be here to help and advise them as needed, and to celebrate their future successes with them. We hope that they will continue to be as proud of their Galen heritage as we are of them."

We look forward to working just as closely with our 2022 Year 12 cohort over the coming twelve months and helping them achieve their goals in spite of any

Ashlee Davey wins In2science 'Mentee of the Year'





Ashlee has been Awarded the Mentee of the Year for the In-2Science Program. Having been part of the program at Galen during 2021 she has willingly given up her lunchtime once per week to connect to a university mentor.


In2science is a program that students volunteer to connect with a University STEM eMentor, once a week for 10 weeks (during lunchtimes). Ashlee said she wished to learn more about Neuroscience, and in semester one was matched with a 3rd year Neuroscience student. She loved the program so much and enjoyed her interaction she asked if she could continue with the program. This time her mentor is a PhD Neuroscience student working in research at the Florey Institute. Her connection to both mentors has been amazing, but with Georgia Eleftheriou it was an extra special connection, they clicked from the get go and hope to continue their mentoring relationship in 2023 when the program begins again. Due to the way she has interacted with both her mentors, Ashlee has been awarded the Mentee of the Year. Ashlee was also part of the In2science KBR Engineering/ STEM Professional program where she got to chat to industry professionals about careers in STEM.

On December 14 she traveled to Melbourne with her family to accept the Award and got to meet her eMentor in person. She was presented with the Award by The Hon Jon Brumby (ex Premier of Victoria) and Chair of In2science.

Ashlee was over the moon and very excited, as was her family. When Ashlee met Georgia face to face for the first time, they were like long lost friends catching up with each other, they didn't stop chatting the whole night.

There are about 3,500 students across Victoria participating in the program so for Ashlee to get nominated and win the Award is pretty exciting. She follows in the footsteps of Imogen Quilty, Maddy Baumanis (finalists in 2017), Annabel

Martinac, winner 2019. So Galen students have really thrown themselves into the program over the years.



Mind Mental Health and Wellbeing Hubs

Information for referrers



The Victorian Government has funded community mental health services to meet the increased demand for mental health support resulting from the stressors and concerns of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Mental Health and Wellbeing Hubs aim to relieve pressure on existing specialist and general practice services by using community health and non-government mental health and wellbeing support organisations. Mind Australia will be operating seven Mental Health and Wellbeing Hubs to complement clinical interventions and treatment by actively supporting the recovery of people with emerging or existing mental ill health.

Who is this service for?

The Mental Health and Wellbeing Hubs will be available to all Victorians of all ages who have symptoms of psychological distress and mental ill health. It is expected that this will include people who do not meet the threshold for tertiary support from Area Mental Health Services.

What support will be offered?

The Mental Health and Wellbeing Hubs will provide a mix of telehealth and face-to-face support, and support for families and carers.

The support will be focused on quick, effective responses to alleviate distress. This could be intensive support for a very short period (less than one week) or up to a couple of months.





Where will the service be located?

These services are currently available through telehealth. The full service offering will be in place by the end of November, involving a blend of mobile outreach, walk-in locations and online delivery. Mind is securing opportunities to co-locate with existing services across each catchment to build a physical 'pop up' presence in the areas where there is demand and in line with COVID-19 restrictions.

Access and Referrals

Mind is building targeted referral pathways with existing providers to relieve the demand on their services. These providers can send enquiries and referrals directly to Mind Mental Health and Wellbeing Hubs via email: mentalhealthhubs@mindaustralia.org.au

Initial calls for support from consumers will go through the Partners in Wellbeing helpline: 1300 375 330.

Partners in Wellbeing staff will complete an initial discussion about support needs and provide a referral to Mind Mental Health and Wellbeing Hubs.
